



FAIRSING VINEYARD 2018 Rosé of Pinot Noir

The Vintage

The 2018 growing season was ideal. Following a mild and dry winter, our vines enjoyed a moderately cool spring with bud break April 18. The summer was one of the warmest and driest on record and free from heat stress.

Light rains at the start of September were followed by two weeks of cool nights and warm days. The cooler temperatures slowed the ripening process and we harvested our select Pommard and Dijon 777 blocks for this estate Rosé of Pinot noir September 14, 2018.

This combination of Dijon 777 and Pommard selections soaked ten hours on the skins and was allowed to settle for an additional 48 hours before barrel fermentation in neutral French oak.

This wine experienced total elevage time of five months before bottling March 15, 2018. The final alcohol is 13.5%

The Vineyard

Fairsing Vineyard is managed sustainably in Oregon's Yamhill-Carlton American Viticulture Area (AVA) with 38 acres of Pinot noir and five acres of Chardonnay in production.

The vineyard is nestled inside an 80-acre Certified Family Forest distinguished by biodiversity, varied topography, and panoramic views of the Northern Willamette Valley.

With over 40 years of viticulture and winemaking knowledge, Robert Brittan's extensive winemaking experience ensures Fairsing Vineyard wines reflect the abundant beauty and complexity of our estate.

Tasting Notes

This 2018 Rosé of Pinot Noir with beautiful coral hue, is balanced and refreshing. Inviting summer scents waft from the glass. On the palate sweet strawberry and poached stone fruits marry with crisp acidity.
