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Estate Profile

Fairsing intertwines the indelible farming and merchant traditions of Irish ancestors to nurture and craft estate wines that articulate a true sense of place. Nestled high in the hills of Oregon's Coast Range and spanning nearly 200 acres, Fairsing is distinguished by its elevation, varied topography and diverse micro-climates. The foundation of Fairsing Vineyard soils is coarse-grained silty loam developed from ancient marine-sediment parent rock. Soil series include Windy Gap, Bellpine, Goodin, and Dupee. Pinot noir and Chardonnay vines thrive among forested acres, oak savanna, native grasses, wildlife corridors, a family orchard, gardens, wildflower meadows, and an apiary.

Climate and Topography

Fairsing Vineyard is ideal for growing cool climate varietals. Temperatures generally average approximately 2,400 cumulative growing degree days over the growing season. On most days, northeast breezes from the Columbia Gorge warm the vineyard and late afternoon winds shift to the southwest and funnel the cooling influence of the Pacific Ocean through the Van Duzer Corridor. Fairsing vine blocks span rolling ridges, crest steep slopes and a few are cradled in deep intervening draws. Undulated topography combines with an optimal south-southeast site aspect to create unique maturation profiles and wines of signature depth and texture.

Viticulture

Fairsing Vineyard utilizes precision viticulture practices. Early season shoot positioning and leaf pulling in select vine blocks enhances vine canopy airflow and improves sunlight exposure. Fairsing is dry-farmed and tillage across the estate is minimized to protect soil structure. Compost is formulated on site and broadcast seasonally to balance nutrients. Vine health and open canopies are carefully managed by maintaining or removing alleyway cover crop to regulate vigor. Crop yields are monitored to enhance flavor concentration. All Fairsing vines are hand harvested.
